## What is a Huddle Group?

A huddle group is a group of 3-5 Christians who are committed to gathering together on a weekly basis to go deeper into pursuing relationship in Christian community and challenging each other to set spiritual goals that can help build their faith stronger.

## Things that Make HUDL Thrive:


- MAKE IT A PRIORITY Be committed your huddle group expects you to make it each week.
- CHOOSE TO BE VULNERABLE let your barriers down. Be open and honest.
- TREAT OTHERS WITH RESPECT -
- HAVE FUN! laugh, love each other
- COMMITMENT Be consistent Find a time and place to huddle each week.

### **During Every Huddle Time**

 WHERE ARE YOU TODAY? CHALLENGE OR GROW? Ask every huddle member if they need to be challenged to grow or if they need to be invited and encouraged more in their relationship with God and with each other.

### • WHAT IS GOD DOING?

- Have every huddle member share a moment or experience in which God is trying to get their attention or ask them to grow right now.
- WHAT ARE YOU DOING?
  - Have every huddle member share something they need to set as a spiritual goal right now in life. Follow up on this goal every week (whatever it may be). If you need to set the goal again, set it again.
- UP, OUT, IN "A disciple is who Jesus would be if he were you" when you read this quote, what do you think it means?
  - Look at the Triangle Shape from below read through each of the three scriptures attached to each triangle point and clarify more deeply
    - UP Luke 6:12 We need to spend time with God even Jesus needed it.
    - OUT Luke 6:17-19
    - IN Luke 6:13-16
  - Questions to consider together
    - How that scripture relates to that point?
    - How does the teaching from Micah 6:8 "Act, Love, Walk" connect to these three points of the Triangle?
    - Which part of the triangle do you gravitate towards? Which part of the triangle do you shy away from? Why?
